Announcements

Verse: *In Rama was there a voice heard, lamentation, and weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, and would not be comforted, because they are not. – Matthew 2:18.*

Commentary: This verse from the Gospel of Saint Matthew refers to the weeping and lamentation that took place in Bethlehem after the soldiers of Herod came and slaughtered the infants in an attempt to kill Christ. These infants were the first martyrs for Christ, and are commemorated on the 29th day of December, Old Style (11 January New Style). There is a church dedicated to their memory in Bethlehem, with the relics of these martyrs. We serve a moleben to them every year to pray for the cessation of the slaughter of the innocents that is taking place every day in our country and in Russia.

Services

St John of Kronstadt: The service on Wednesday night, 31 October, on the eve of St John of Kronstadt, was cancelled due to the storm.

Please remember that Halloween is a pagan festival and that trick-or-treating comes from the Druid worship of the dead. Our Christian ancestors suffered martyrdom and torment rather than burn a pinch of incense to the Roman gods, yet many parents willingly let their children participate in a ceremony of pagan worship.

Daylight Time Ends on 4 November: By Act of Congress the start of Daylight Time has been moved from the last Sunday in October to the first Sunday in November. Therefore please set your clocks one hour behind on Saturday night 3 November. It may help to remember which way to set your clock by the saying “Spring Forward, Fall Behind.” Let us at any rate enjoy our extra hour of sleep this weekend.

St Demetrius Pannychida: A general pannychida for Orthodox Christians fallen in battle will be served at 3 pm Saturday 3 November.

Archangel Michael: Vespers with Litya will be held at 6:30 pm on Tuesday 20 November, the eve of the Feast of the Holy Archangel Michael and All Bodiless Powers. There will be no Liturgy on the day of the Feast itself.

Thanksgiving Day: A Service of Thanksgiving will be served at 9:30 am on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday 22 November. Let us remember why we celebrate this day, and dedicate it to thanking the All-Good Lord for all the benefits He has bestowed on us this past year. This year there are four non-fasting days after Thanksgiving to eat leftovers before the Nativity Fast begins. Whatever non-fasting foods are not eaten during this time should be frozen and saved until Christmas, 7 January.

St Nectarios: This year Thanksgiving Day coincides with the commemoration of St Nectarios of Pentapolis, whose hymns will be included in the Service of Thanksgiving. A service to St Nectarios will also be served on Thursday evening 8 November at Christ the Savior Orthodox Church in Southbury (see the announcement under Orthodox Neighbors).

Nativity Fast (Advent): The Nativity Fast begins on Wednesday 28 November and continues until Christmas Day, 7 January. During this time we abstain from meat, eggs and dairy products. On Wednesdays and Fridays we also abstain from fish, wine and oil. Some keep a strict fast Mondays. The fast becomes stricter on the day after Ss Spyridon and Herman, 25 December, after which we do not eat fish until Christmas Day.

Molebens: We will serve a moleben for the lesser holy days in November. Molebens on weeknights will begin at 6:30 pm: Monday 5 November for *St James the Brother of the Lord*, and

Wednesday 7 November for *St Demetrius* (on the eve due to the celebration at Christ the Savior Church in Southbury on 8 November). The moleben for the *Great-Martyr Menas* will be held at 4 pm Saturday 24 November.

St Herman Conference

With the blessing of His Eminence, Metropolitan Hilarion, First Hierarch of the Russian Orthodox Church Outside of Russia, and of His Eminence, Archbishop Gabriel of Montreal and All Canada and Chairman of the St Herman's Executive Committee, the annual St Herman of Alaska Youth Conference will be held at *St Panteleimon's Church in Hartford CT* on 23-27 December. Andrei Desnitsky, a well known speaker from Moscow who has a vast knowledge of the Holy Scriptures and of the various translations in the Russian language, will lecture and assist in workshops.

The cost for the conference will be a discounted rate of \$275 prior to the November 30 deadline and includes lodging (quad occupancy), meals, and local transportation. Limited scholarships are available. After November 30, the price will increase to \$300. For further information and registration, please visit the website at www.sthermanconference.com.

Our Parish

Visit of the Hawaii Iveron Icon: On Saturday 20 October the wonder-working Hawaii Iveron Icon of the Mother of God visited our parish. The Meeting of the Icon was a little after 3 pm, during which the Icon was taken in procession around the Altar and then placed on an icon stand in the middle of the church. During the singing of the Acathist, a Moleben was served with the reading of hundreds of names for health and salvation. Present were Frs Peter Paproski of St John the Baptist Church on Broadbridge Ave and Fr George Coca of St Dimitrie's Church in Easton, as well as about 150 visitors. Reader Nectarios, the guardian of the Icon, gave the parish a vial of myrrh from the Icon, and some cotton soaked in the myrrh. This visit was a great blessing and consolation to our parish and to all who came.

Hurricane Sandy: In anticipation of Hurricane Sandy, which struck our area on 29 and 30 October, and at the request of Metropolitan Hilarion, our Diocesan Bishop, we added special petitions and the *Prayer at the Threat from Malevolent Winds and Sea Storms* to the Divine Liturgy on Sunday 28 October. A cursory examination has shown no apparent damage to the church or the grounds; however, there was an interruption of power, and a great tree fell on the parish's lot across the street. We have not yet heard how our parishioners have fared.

Candle Desk Duty: We need people to watch the Candle Desk, handle donations, light candles, and ring the bell during services – one person for Vigil and two for the Divine Liturgy. Unfortunately, we are not always able to find people for all positions. It is sad for visitors to come and find no parishioners to greet them, but only the servers and singers. Please sign up if you are able to come.

Lampada Sponsorship: Offerings may be made to sponsor the lighting the lampadas at the Divine Liturgy, either in memory of loved ones, or in gratitude for blessings received, or for any other good intention. The sponsorship of the lampadas is \$25 for all the lampadas in the church. Register at the Candle Desk if you wish to sponsor the lampadas, in whole or in part, on a Sunday of your choice.

Liturgical Notes

Note: This section is included in our Bulletin so that Fr George may have help changing the altar cloths and vestments at the appropriate times. This is a lot of work, but goes much more easily with a few helping hands.

Blue: Some altar cloths and all vestments will be Blue on Sunday 4 November in honor of the Kazan Icon of the Mother of God.

Gold: Altar cloths and vestments are Gold from the beginning of the month.

Red: On Sunday afternoon, 27 November, the altar cloths and vestments are changed to Red for the beginning of the Nativity Fast. They remain until the eve of the Feast of the Entry of the Mother of God into the Temple, Saturday 3 December.

This Election

To Bear in Mind: *The Church would not normally intervene in a political process, but in view of the recent action of the current Administration in imposing on Roman Catholic charitable organizations a mandate that they must supply all their employees paid access to birth control and abortion, which violates their principles and conscience, and in view of the fact that one of the major political parties has made as one of their stated principles the availability of abortion on demand for any reason and at any time at public expense, we thought it well to remind our readers of the following before the General Election:*

- While the Orthodox Church does not have a publicly stated political position on this issue, she has however confessed consistently throughout her history from the Apostolic times to the present day that abortion is murder. It is the taking of a human life into which God has breathed a living soul. An unborn child is not a “mass of unviable fetal tissue,” it is a human being. By six to eight weeks the fetus is a tiny, but recognizable baby. He/she has a beating heart, eyes, face and a soul. Abortion is a brutal, gruesome and hideous procedure in which a baby, a living human being is cut up and torn limb-from-limb and thrown away as garbage.
- An attack on the religious principles of one faith is an attack on all faiths. Orthodox Bishops of all jurisdictions, including our own, have joined with the Roman Catholic Bishops and leaders of other faiths in publicly protesting this mandate. If this mandate stands, the Roman Catholic Church will have to

close all their charitable activities or violate their conscience. This mandate also threatens all other private and religious charities, and their closure would be a great loss to our country.

- Not everything that is legal is moral. Whatever the outcome of the political process, it is our duty to do what we can to make society better, to persuade people not to resort to abortion, and to support those mothers who have the courage to carry their babies to term. We should give to worthy causes such as *Birthright* (www.birthright.org, tel. 800 550-4900) We should help those of our family and acquaintance who turn out to be pregnant out of wedlock by giving our own resources, time and attention. We should also not judge those who out of desperation have obtained abortions. Let such people trust in the mercy of God, for where there is repentance there is forgiveness and reconciliation with God.
- None of the candidates for public office are Orthodox Christians, and no candidate is perfect. But as voters and electors of our public officials, we share moral responsibility for their policies. In some cases there is a clear choice. If a candidate will not stand for the life of the defenseless, how can any positive qualities balance this? Before we vote, let us pause and pray for the good of our country, and for the wisdom to choose rightly. If we cannot choose candidates that will do good, at least we can choose those that will do the least harm.

The Orthodox Church does not issue political statements, and imposes no political tests on her faithful, but we must remember that we will give account before God at the Dread Judgement for our choices.

Question and Answer

Q – Kissing the Priest’s Hand after Communion: *I was wondering, What is the rule about kissing the priest’s hand after Communion? What about kissing the Cross at the end of the Liturgy? I see some people do it and some people do not.*

A: We should not kiss anything after we have received Communion. This is because we have received the Body and Blood of our Saviour, and when we kiss anything, we might leave a trace on the object we kiss. Therefore we do not kiss the priest’s hand after Communion, nor do we kiss the Cross at the end of the Liturgy. This rule no longer holds after we have eaten anything, which is why in the Russian Church we have the *zapivka*, the bread and wine on a tray in the middle of the church, after receiving Communion. After receiving the *zapivka* we can kiss the icons and the Cross. Not all Orthodox Churches have the *zapivka*, and so they may require us not to kiss the priest’s hand or the icons after Communion until after the day’s meal.
