Reminder on Parish Dues: At the beginning of the academic and ecclesiastical year (the Church New Year is 14 September), our Treasurer, Anastasia Milligan asks our parishioners to remember their dues, and please not wait until just before the Annual Meeting next February to get caught up. Our church needs continuous funding to meet our obligations and to keep up with the utilities.

The cost is not great - \$150 per adult, or \$300 for families with two adults and any number of children. This amounts to about \$12.50 a month per person. We also have an introductory rate for students.

Services

St John of Kronstadt: Thursday the 31st of October is the eve of St John of Kronstadt. Vespers for the Saint will begin at 6:30 pm.

We will be hosting a Children's Party after Vespers for those families who wish to keep their children off the streets.

Please remember that Halloween is a pagan festival and that trick-or-treating comes from the Druid worship of the dead. Our Christian ancestors suffered martyrdom and torment rather than burn a pinch of incense to the Roman gods, yet many parents willingly let their children participate in a ceremony of pagan worship. Please come and pray in church in honor of a great modern Christian Orthodox Saint whose eve coincides with the pagan Halloween. Please feel free to bring a dish, some candy, or a game to share.

St Demetrius Pannychida: A general pannychida for Orthodox Christians fallen in battle will be served at 3 pm Saturday 2 November.

Daylight Time Ends on 3 November: By Act of Congress the start of Daylight Time has been moved from the last Sunday in October to the first Sunday in November. Therefore please set your clocks one hour behind on Saturday night 2 November. It may help to remember which way to set your clock by the saying "Spring Forward, Fall Behind." Let us at any rate enjoy our extra hour of sleep this weekend.

St Nectarios: A service to St Nectarios will be served on Friday evening 8 November at Christ the Savior Orthodox Church in Southbury to which all parishes are invited (see the announcement under Orthodox Neighbors). We will serve a Moleben to St Nectarios at St Nicholas Church at 6:30 pm on Friday 22 November.

Nativity Fast (Advent): The Nativity Fast begins on Thursday 28 November, which is Thanksgiving this year, and continues until Christmas Day, 7 January. During this time we abstain from meat, eggs and dairy products. On Wednesdays and Fridays we also abstain from fish, wine and oil. Some keep a strict fast Mondays. The fast becomes stricter on the day after Ss Spyridon and Herman, 25 December, after which we do not eat fish until Christmas Day.

Thanksgiving Day: A Service of Thanksgiving will be served at 9:30 am on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday 28 November. Let us remember why we celebrate this day, and dedicate it to thanking the All-Good Lord for all the benefits He has bestowed on us this past year.

Molebens: We will serve a moleben for the lesser holy days in November. A Moleben to the **Kazan Icon** of the Mother of God will be at 1:30 pm Sunday 3 November (or after the Brotherhood Roast Beef Dinner). Molebens on weeknights will begin at 6:30 pm: Tuesday 5 November for **St James the Brother of the Lord**, Thursday 7 November for **St Demetrius** (on the eve due to the celebration at Christ the Savior Church in Southbury on 8 November), Thursday 21 November for the **Holy Archangel Michael** and All Bodiless Powers, and Friday 22 November for **St Nectarios** of Pentapolis.

Announcements – November 2013

Thanksgiving

About Thanksgiving Day and the Fast: This year the Nativity Fast begins on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday 28 November. This happens on the average of one out of seven years. Effectively the fast begins the day before, on Wednesday 27 November, since Wednesdays are also fast days. As Orthodox Christians, we do not break the fast for the sake of secular holidays – and Thanksgiving is not a Church holiday – and so we should keep the fast on this day. What should we do, therefore, about the traditional Thanksgiving dinner? We have three choices:

1.) We could transfer the family Thanksgiving dinner to the previous Sunday, 24 November, and celebrate as a parish on that day, as the parishioners of our sister parish of the Presentation of the Lord do every year.

2.) We could transfer the Thanksgiving dinner to Tuesday, the last non-fasting day before Christmas. Or

3.) We could keep the family Thanksgiving meal on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday 28 November, but with a different menu in keeping with the Fast.

Since this is a Thursday, and some permit fish on Thursdays, we could substitute stuffed salmon or other large fish for turkey as the main course. There are a number of harvest-themed entrees that we could serve: mashed potatoes, yams, sweet potatoes, corn on the cob, turnips, squash, all with margarine instead of butter, and if necessary non-dairy creamer instead of milk. Stuffing can likewise be made without the turkey broth, milk and butter, but with the broth of the broiled or baked fish, or without broth. There are several commercially available stuffing mixes that are fasting. Cranberry sauce is fasting. Instead of pumpkin pie, have a fruit pie with a fasting crust, apple, blueberry or rhubarb.

And so we can still have a festive meal on Thanksgiving, and yet observe the Fast. Please remember, though, that we should be reasonable in our consumption, for gluttony is a sin, and the point of the fast is to bring our appetites under control. So let us not go overboard by devouring huge quantities of food.

Sisterhood Dues: Sisterhood dues for the year 2013-2014 are due in September. If you have forgotten, please see the Sisterhood Treasurer. All ladies in our parish, older or younger, are invited to participate in service to the Church by joining the Sisterhood. The dues are modest: only \$24 a year.

St Herman Conference

With the blessing of His Eminence, Metropolitan Hilarion, First Hierarch of the Russian Orthodox Church Outside of Russia, and of His Eminence, Archbishop Gabriel of Montreal and All Canada and Chairman of the St Herman's Executive Committee, the annual St Herman of Alaska Youth Conference will be held from Sunday 22 through Thursday 26 December in Sea Cliff and Glen Cove NY jointly at *St Seraphim's and Holy Protection Churches*. The featured speaker will be *Fr Anastasy Yatreliis* of Ss Cyril and Methodius Church in Somerville SC, who will speak on Youth and Mission.

The cost for the conference will be a discounted rate of \$275 prior to the December 3 deadline and includes lodging, meals, and local transportation. Limited scholarships are available. Blue: Some altar cloths and all vestments will be Blue after the Liturgy on Sunday 4 November in honor of the Kazan Icon of the Mother of God, and are changed back to Gold on Monday evening 5 November.

Gold: Altar cloths and vestments are Gold from the beginning of the month.

Red: On Wednesday afternoon, 27 November, the altar cloths and vestments are changed to Red for the beginning of the Nativity Fast. They remain until the eve of the Feast of the Entry of the Mother of God into the Temple, Tuesday 3 December.
