On Thursday 1 October our iconographer, Oleg Trofimenko delivered the icons of the Four Evangelists that will be installed in the four pendentives (the triangular spaces under the main dome of our church). The icons are on canvas, which will be affixed to the wall. The Evangelists are in large circular medallions, and so the small regions in the three corners of the pendentives will be filled with decorative work

which will be painted on-site. Oleg will be working mostly on Saturdays throughout the month of October.

Fundraisers: To cover the costs of the new icons that are not yet covered, and to prepare for further work on the iconography of our church, we will be holding fundraisers in the near future (to be announced). In the meanwhile we may appreciate the beauty of the new icons and look forward to more with anticipation.

Services

Saturday Vigil in October: For the duration of October, the Saturday evening Vigil service *will begin at 6:30 pm* instead of at 5 pm. This will allow our iconographer, Oleg Trofimenko, to install and paint the icons of the Four Evangelists in the pendentives (triangles) under the main dome of our church.

Scaffolding: For the duration of October, the scaffolding now stored along the north wall of the church and in the entrance way downstairs will be assembled to allow work on our iconography project. We will conduct services as usual while the scaffolding remains assembled, but moved to the side. We apologize for the inconvenience, but look forward to the prospect of a beautiful sanctuary.

St Sergius of Radonezh Chapel: On Thursday 8 October, the day of the repose of St Sergius of Radonezh, V Rev Archpriest Constantine Semyanko will serve at the St Sergius Chapel at Churaevka, 85 Russian Village Rd, Southbury CT) – Lesser Blessing of Waters 8 am; and Divine Liturgy 9 am. For more information call 860 836 1271. Please remember that there are no facilities at the chapel.

Holy Protection: Vespers for Holy Protection will be at 6:30 pm Tuesday 13 October. There will be no Divine Liturgy at St Nicholas Church on the day of the Feast, Wednesday 14 October. Those wishing may attend services at the *Church of the Presentation of our Lord*, 5 Wheeler Terr in Stratford: Acathist at 8:20 am and Divine Liturgy at 9 am on the day of the Feast.

This is the Parish Feast of our sister parish of the *Holy Virgin Protection Church* in Nyack, New York, to whom we extend our congratulations, as well as to their Rector, Archpriest Elias Gorsky and Rector Emeritus, Archpriest George Larin.

Memorial Services: The *Peavy, Wolog, Brockert and Milligan* families will be holding a pannychida after the Divine Liturgy on *Sunday 11 October* in memory of Natalia Wolog and Vladimir (Walter) Brockert. Also to be commemorated are the parents and brother of our Treasurer, Anastasia Milligan. The

families invite our parishioners to the memorial meal to be held downstairs in the Church Hall after the pannychida.

On *Sunday 18 October* there will be a litya in memory *Bishop Ioasaph* (Fr Stephan Antonuk), Matushka Elikonida and Olga Antonuk.

St John of Kronstadt: This year St John's day falls on a Sunday. His service will combine with the regular Sunday services: Vigil at 6:30 pm Saturday 31 October, and Divine Liturgy 10 am Sunday 1 November.

Please remember that Halloween is a pagan festival and that trick-or-treating comes from the Druid worship of the dead. Our Christian ancestors suffered martyrdom and torment rather than burn a pinch of incense to the Roman gods, yet many parents willingly let their children participate in a ceremony of pagan worship. Please come and pray in church in honor of a great modern Christian Orthodox Saint whose eve coincides with the pagan Halloween.

Molebens: To celebrate lesser holy days in October, we will serve a Moleben to St Sergius of Radonezh on Thursday 8 October and to St John the Evangelist and Theologian on Friday 9 October. Both services are at 9:30 pm.

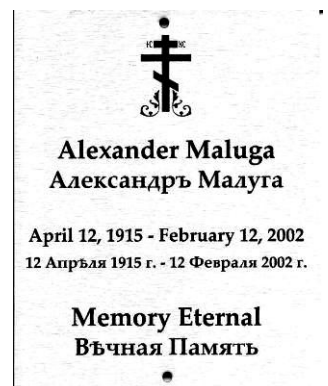
Daylight Time Ends on 1 November: By Act of Congress the start of Daylight Time has been moved from the last Sunday in October to the first Sunday in November. Therefore please set your clocks one hour behind on Saturday night 31 October. It may help to remember which way to set your clock by the saying "Spring Forward, Fall Behind."

Prosporas

Prospora Baking: A prospora baking party was held on Saturday 12 September. Our Parish

Alexander Maluga: When our parishioner Alexander Maluga reposed in 2002 the marker on his grave was overlooked. A few years later, Ludmila Skorik donated a pair of tall wooden crosses made by her late father, Boris Skorik. The crosses have been in storage ever since. This summer we decided to use one of the crosses for Alexander's grave. As the crosses had become weathered while stored outdoors, our Starosta Dexter Peavy refinished them with white paint, and Paul Przybylski designed a plaque (pictured) to put on the cross and had it made. Adzima received the cross and the plaque, and Adzima's Funeral Home had the marker installed the following day.

At 1:30 pm Saturday 11 October Fr George will bless the grave marker and serve a Pannychida at Alexander Maluga's grave in St John's Cemetery, 500 Moose Hill Rd, Monroe CT. Alexander Maluga was a historian of the Carpatho-Russian emigration and a frequent contributor to the journal *Karpatska Rus*.

Liturgical Notes

We include this section so that Fr George may have help changing the altar cloths and vestments at the appropriate times. This is a lot of work, but goes much more easily with a few helping hands.

Red: Before Vigil on Friday 25 September the altar cloths and vestments are changed to Red for the Forefeast of Holy Cross. The red cloths are placed over the gold. They remain until the apodosis of the Feast, Sunday 4 October.

Gold: After Liturgy on Sunday 4 October, the altar cloths and vestments are changed to Gold (when the red is removed, the gold will show beneath).

Blue: Before Vespers on Tuesday 13 October, the altar cloths and vestments are changed to Blue for the feast of the Protection of the Mother of God.

Gold: On Wednesday evening 14 October, the altar cloths and vestments return to Gold for the balance of the month.

Did You Know?

Veneration of the Cross: The Cross is decorated with sweet basil and red carnations and placed on an analogion (icon stand) in the middle of the church for veneration two times in the year, namely on Mid-Lent Sunday and on the Elevation of the Cross in September.

- When the Cross is in the middle of the church, we venerate when we enter the church at the beginning of the service and when we leave the church at the end of the service.
- When we do this we make two prostrations to the ground with the sign of the Cross, then we kiss the Cross, and we make one final prostration. With each prostration we say the words, *Thy Cross do we worship, O Master, and Thy holy Resurrection we glorify (Кресту Твоему)*.
- We make the prostrations even if it is Sunday. This is the one exception to the rule that we never make prostrations on Sundays.
- The Choir sings *Thy Cross do we worship, O Master* during the Divine Liturgy in place of the usual Trisagion Hymn (*Holy God; Святый Боже*).
- Although some make prostrations at this point, this is not correct. **We do not make prostrations during the Liturgy**, and this is especially because we are not approaching the Cross to venerate it.
- We venerate the Cross as a congregation, one by one, at the end of Matins when the priest comes out to anoint the people at the end of the Great Doxology (*Glory to God in the highest; Слава въ вышнихъ Богу*).

Saying the Lord's Prayer During the Services: The Lord's Prayer (*Our Father; Отче нашъ*) is said, often more than once in every Orthodox service, and in every order of prayer in the Prayer Book. Accordingly, we should know it by heart, and it should be part of our daily life. The Lord's Prayer is sung with especial solemnity during the Divine Liturgy, and all the faithful are called to participate in singing it as a congregation.

However, the Lord's Prayer is also appointed to be read by the Reader at certain services, such as Vespers, Matins, the Hours, Memorial Services (Pannychidas), Supplicatory Services (Molebens), and during Funerals. These are not appointed for congregational singing, and should be read only by the Reader, as it maintains the smooth flow of the reading. **It is therefore a mistake for those present to repeat the Lord's Prayer aloud** with the Reader at the part of the services which are read rather than sung. This disturbs the flow of the service and takes attention away from the reading, and it is neither in the Typicon nor is it the common practice of the Russian Church.

This usage has taken root in some parishes of certain other jurisdictions, where while not universal, it seems to be common in

New England parishes.

We ask our people not to recite the Lord's Prayer if a Reader is reading it as part of the service, but we should sing the Prayer (as well as the Creed – *Вѣрую*) congregationally when it is sung by the Choir during the Liturgy. If a Priest of another jurisdiction should serve a Funeral in our church (as happens occasionally) and has his own Reader, he may follow his usual practice. And of course, when we are guests in another parish we should respect their practices.
