Services

Time of Saturday Vigil: Until the iconography work is completed, the Saturday evening Vigil will begin at 6:30 pm instead of at 5 pm. We anticipate the last Saturday for late hours will be the 14th of this month.

Scaffolding: Until the iconography work is complete, the scaffolding will occupy part of the church (the Nave) under the dome. We will conduct services as usual while the scaffolding remains assembled, but moved to the side. We apologize for the inconvenience, but look forward to the prospect of a beautiful sanctuary.

Daylight Time Ends on 1 November: By Act of Congress the start of Daylight Time has been moved from the last Sunday in October to the first Sunday in November. Therefore please set

your clocks one hour behind on Saturday night 31 October. It may help to remember which way to set your clock by the saying “Spring Forward, Fall Behind.”

St Nectarios: A service to St Nectarios will be served on Sunday evening 8 November at Christ the Savior Orthodox Church in Southbury to which all parishes are invited (*see the announcement under Orthodox Neighbors*). We will celebrate St Nectarios at St Nicholas Church on Sunday 22 November, including Vigil with a Polyelos.

Archangel Michael and All Bodiless Powers: Vespers at 6:30 pm Friday 20 November. No Liturgy on the day of the Feast, Saturday 21 November.

Thanksgiving Day: A Service of Thanksgiving will be served at 9:30 am on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday 26 November. Let us remember why we celebrate this day, and dedicate it to thanking the All-Good Lord for all the benefits He has bestowed on us this past year.

Nativity Fast (Advent): The Nativity Fast begins on Saturday 28 November, and continues until Christmas Day, 7 January. The day before, Friday 27 November, which is the day after Thanksgiving, is also a fast day.

During this time we abstain from meat, eggs and dairy products. On Wednesdays and Fridays we also abstain from fish, wine and oil. Some keep a strict fast Mondays. The fast becomes stricter on the day after Ss Spyridon and Herman, 25 December, after which we do not eat fish until Christmas Day. If we have leftovers from Thanksgiving, we can put them in the freezer until after Christmas.

Molebens: We will serve a moleben for the lesser holy days in November. Molebens on weeknights will begin at 6:30 pm: Wednesday 4 November for the *Kazan Icon* of the Mother of God; Thursday 5 November for *St James the Brother of the Lord*; and Tuesday 24 November for *Great Martyr Menas*.

Our Parish

Almost Finished: Our iconographer, Oleg Trofimenko installed the new icons of the Four Evangelists in the pendentives under the dome in our church on Saturday 3 October. Since then he has been working on the ornamental borders in the corners of the pendentives, which must be done by hand. We anticipate the work will be finished in the middle of this month.

Alexander Maluga: On Saturday 11 October Fr George blessed the grave marker and served a Pannychida at Alexander Maluga’s grave in St John’s Cemetery in Monroe. Eight people were present at the event including Paul Best, Chairman of the Carpatho-Russian Association. Our parishioner Alexander Maluga reposed in 2002, but until now had no grave marker. He was a historian of the Carpatho-Russian emigration and a frequent contributor to the journal *Karpatska Rus*.

Lampada Sponsorship: Offerings may be made to sponsor the lighting of the lampadas at the Divine Liturgy, either in memory of loved ones, or in gratitude for blessings received, or for any other good intention. The sponsorship of the lampadas is

\$25 for all the lampadas in the church. Register at the Candle Desk if you wish to sponsor the lampadas, in whole or in part, on a Sunday of your choice.

Utilities: Please remember that on the *first Sunday* of each month there is a special collection for *utilities*.

Liturgical Notes

We include this section so that Fr George may have help changing the altar cloths and vestments at the appropriate times. This is a lot of work, but goes much more easily with a few helping hands.

Gold: Altar cloths and vestments are Gold from the beginning of the month.

Blue: Some altar cloths and all vestments will be Blue Tuesday evening 3 November in honor of the Kazan Icon of the Mother of God, and are changed back to Gold on Wednesday evening 4 November.

Red: On Friday afternoon, 27 November, the altar cloths and vestments are changed to Red for the beginning of the Nativity Fast. They remain until the eve of the Feast of the Entry of the Mother of God into the Temple, Thursday 3 December.

On the Christian Life

"Do not be irritated either with those who sin or those who offend; do not have a passion for noticing every sin in your neighbor, and for judging him, as we are in the habit of doing. Everyone shall give an answer to God for himself. Everyone has a conscience; everyone hears God's Word, and knows God's Will either from books or from conversation with other people. Especially do not look with evil intention upon the sins of your elders, which do not regard you; To his own master he standeth or falleth (Romans 14:4). Correct your own sins, amend your own life."

Remember the Sabbath Day: The Fourth Commandment states, *Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day is the Sabbath of the LORD thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter* (Exodus 18:8-10). Do we keep the Lord's day fittingly? Do we attend the Divine Services? Do we transact secular business on the Holy Day? Are we people of the

Lord, or are we no different from all the nations of the earth who do not know the Lord?

As Orthodox Christians we are committed to the Holiness of God, and all things that are His. Our bodies, our lives, our possessions, our time is not our own, but a gift of God, and to Him will we give it all back when we stand before His Judgement Seat.

The Lord's Day begins at sundown on Saturday evening and ends on sundown Sunday evening. That time is holy to the Lord. We should spend that time in prayer, in thanksgiving to God Who made us and gave us everything. We should attend the Divine Services – the Vigil on Saturday night, and the Divine Liturgy on Sunday morning. Nothing should be more important than that. When we come to the Divine Services, we should come early to be there to help set up (light candles, etc.), and to put ourselves in a prayerful frame of mind beforehand. We should stay until the end to receive the final blessing.

Attendance at the Divine Services: Unless we have specific reason to step out of the service we should be present from the time we arrive until the last Amen. It has come to our attention that some are in the habit of spending time downstairs at leisure during the service. Lest we become an occasion of offense to God, we should not leave the Divine Service except in great need. This would imply :

- We are directly preparing the meal for the Coffee Hour. This should be kept to the barest minimum, and we should be upstairs when we have no immediate matter to attend to. It is better to set things up before the Service so that only the final touches need to be done just before Coffee Hour.
- We are conducting Church School after the children have received Communion. All preparation for the lesson should be made before the Service, and we should accompany the children downstairs. No one else who is not participating in the lesson should be downstairs.
- We are tending to the urgent needs of a baby or small child.
- Nature calls.

If we do not have any of the above mentioned needs, then we should not be downstairs, or outside in the church yard. If we do need to go downstairs for these reasons, we should return to the Service as soon as we have finished taking care of our business. We should return quietly, not disturbing others who are praying.

Those who are not teaching Church School and those who are not preparing the meal should remain in the Church for the sermon, and for the final blessing at the end of the Liturgy.

Needless to say, we should also not be availing ourselves of coffee, tea or refreshments during the Divine Service. The serving of refreshments may begin for the children at or after the Church School lessons if the Priest is delayed, but for everyone else the refreshments should not be touched until the food is blessed.
